The Society is a non-profit organisation dedicated to the promotion and advancement of the knowledge of the science and practice of all microscopical imaging, analysis and diffraction techniques useful for elucidating the ultrastructure and function of materials in diverse areas of biological, materials, medical and physical sciences.

The Society's major activities are the convening of multidisciplinary conferences and workshops, the publishing of a quarterly newsletter, and the co-ordination of activities with similar groups within Australia and overseas.

AMMS Inc is a member of the Federation of Australian Scientific and Technological Societies (FASTS), a lobby group that seeks to influence government decision making about science and technology. Special Interest Groups are represented in FASTS by AMMS Inc.

The Australian Microbeam Analysis Society (AMAS)

AMAS concentrates on the important area of chemical analysis using microbeams and runs an independent conference and workshop programme. AMAS operates its own office bearers and committee. AMAS closely co-operates with its US counterpart - the Microbeam Analysis Society - for example with exchange visits by society presidents and by students.

ASPMS concentrates on the growing field of scanned probe microscopy. ASPMS have held conferences and workshops independently and in conjunction with AMAS and AMMS Inc meetings. ASPMS has its own office bearers and committee.

The Microscopical Society of Australia (MSA)

The objective of MSA is the advancement of the science and art of microscopy. The Society shall be concerned with light, electron or other microscopes and with microscopical techniques (specimen preparation, image formation, image analysis, image recording etc) as applied to objects of interest in biology, metallurgy, chemistry, materials or other sciences.

The MSA, which is based in the Sydney area, usually has about five meetings per year with speakers covering a wide range of topics. Notices of meetings and activities are sent out to members. Normally the Society holds a workshop, seminar or keynote lecture annually.

The Australian Electron Microscopy Email Newsgroup (AUSTEM)

AUSTEM provides a rapid means of communication between Australian microscopists for meeting and course announcements, problem solving, equipment for sale, donation or wanted, and other issues of local concern (as opposed to the world wide Microscopy Listserver).
